It is the left-hand companion to a right side which told the personal story of Mrs Victoria Matthews, a local first people Elder with a past connection with Maitland Methodist Church. Beatie presented the banner to Bolwarra congregation members, Samantha Roberts and Leaders Louise Trist and Lindsay Moxey.
